of this my last will and testament I have made Constituted and Appointed my sons John Anthony and James Anthony to be my only and sole Executors Requesting them to take Care and Pay all my just and Lawfull Debts to gether with Every Request or ^{debt} due here in before mentioned and yearly Pay ment of twenty Pounds in the Bills of Credit as aforesaid to my wife their mother during the term of her Widowhood and I ordain my said Executors shall have use and Profit of my home stead fifty year more over also I bequeath unto my said son John Anthony & James Anthony my said Executors all my Estate both Real & Personal what so ever and where so Ever which I have not other way is disposed of

Finally I Do hereby Revoke make null and void all and Every other former Testament and Will what so ever by me made or Declared Confirming and Approving this and no other to be my last will and testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the twenty sixth day of may one thousand seven hundred and thirty nine and in the twelfth year of his majesties Reign George the second King of Great Brittain
