

Theo. Goddier Will

In the name of God Amen the Sixth day of March in the Second year of his Reign of our Sovereign Lord
George the Second by the grace of God of Great Britain France and Ireland King Defender of the Faith & Anno Dom 1729. I Thomas
Goodier of Newton in the parish of Moulam and County of Chester Esquire being indisposed as to my bodily health but of sound and disposing
memory thanks be to Almighty God and calling to mind the uncertainty of life do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament first of
all I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God, and my body to the Earth hoping through the merits of Jesus Christ
my Lord and Saviour to receive full and free pardon and remission of all my sins And as touching my temporal estate I
give devise and dispose of the same as follows As to my Messuage and Estate in Newton aforesaid I have by a certain Assignment
bearing date on or about the fourth day of this instant last past assigned over the same for the use of Mary my wife and my
son Thomas as in the said assignment is mentioned and declared thereto being laid it doth and may more fully and at large
appear with which assignmt I hereby declare my self to be well pleased and fully satisfied And as to my personal
estate it is my will and mind that just debts (if any such there happen to be) that I owe to any person or persons together
with funeral expenses and the charges of the Probate of this my last Will and Testament and some small charges hereafter
bequeathed to be first paid out of my Personal Estate and after the same are paid and discharged as is herein appointed I give to
my son Thomas as his Loomes the goods hereafter mentioned that is to say the bedstead in the chamber over the kitchen cupboard in y^e kitchen
And the remainder of all my Personal Estate that I am now possessed of, of what nature or kind soever truck or dead in the house
out houses, or upon the premises that is properly my own it is my intent and purpose will and mind that Mary my well beloved
wife have the using and enjoying of the same during all the time and term of her natural life And I give grant and allow unto
her the said Mary my said wife full power and free liberty by her last Will and Testament or any other writing under her hand and seal
equally executed to give and dispose of the same and to make such division and distribution thereof to my son Thomas his child
or children, in case he have any, and my daughter Susannah and her children as she the said Mary in her discretion shall think
most and convenient according as they behave themselves dutifully unto her And I give and bequeath unto Thomas Goodier
my son five shillings, and unto Susannah his Sister, wife of John Mott of Gunley in the County of Derby five shillings, and
to him the said John Mott himself five shillings, and to each of their three children five shillings a piece And vastly
I do nominate and appoint my loving wife Executive of this my last Will and Testament hoping she will perform and fulfill
the same as my trust is in her reposed hereby revoking and making void all former or other will or wills by me heretofore
made or declared and do appoint and declare this only to be my last Will and Testament and no other And witnesseth whereof the
said Thomas Goodier have hereunto interchangably set my hand and seal the day and year first above written.

I do also signe published and declared to be the last Will and
Testament of the Estate in the presence of us who have attested the
execution hereof in the said Estates presence Thomas Turner.
