in and for the County of Ulster on the thirty-fifth
day of July A.D. 1851 Present Jameson Surrogate

Whereas Aaron Goodin and Jonathan
Goodin the Administrators upon the Estate of Aaron
Goodin deceased etc on the 30th day of June 1851
present their Petition to the Surrogate of Ulster
County—this petition duly verified setting forth the
following other things that they were appointed
Administrators upon the Estate of the said deceased
and more than eighteen months ago since that
they had settled the said Estate so far as they
could by law, and now desire to have a final
accounting as such Administrators—On filing
the said Petition the said Surrogate did order
that Citation issue to the heirs and next of kin
returnable on the 22^d day of July A.D. 1851 Citation
issued and served to the Petitioners—On the 22^d
day of July A.D. 1851 the Petition appeared and not
being ready to proceed with the accounting the full
hearing of the matter was adjourned until the
thirty-first day of July aforesaid at which last
time named the Petitioners appeared and presented
the amount duly verified by which it appeared
that they were charged themselves with the sum
of fifteen thousand three hundred and thirty seven
dollars and fifty four cents the amount of the
Inventory and also with the sum of three hundred
twenty five dollars and twenty three cents more
collected and uncollected

and also with the sum of two hundred and
seventy-five dollars and sixty-three cents - making
in all the sum of fifteen thousand eight hundred
eighty-eight dollars and forty cents - of the said
Administrator indebtedness - And it also appears
from said account so far that the said Administrator
had paid out for debts against the estate and for
expenses during the Administration the sum of
two hundred seventy-eight dollars and twenty-seven
cents, and that they had distributed and paid
to the heirs of the deceased the sum of fifteen
thousand four hundred and fifty dollars and
ninety-nine cents - And that they were entitled
to a percentage of two hundred fifty-eight dollars
and that they had paid the deceased three dollars
and fifty cents less than an amounting - making
in all the ~~Administrator's~~ debts credit the sum
of fifteen thousand nine hundred ninety dollars
and twenty cents showing that the said
Administrator had paid out the sum of one
hundred and two dollars and thirty cents more
than they had received from the estate -

And it appearing that the said accounting
was fair and just over that it was ordered
adjudged and deemed by the said Surrogate
that the said Accounting be in all things
confirmed - And it was further ordered
adjudged and deemed by the said Surrogate
that the said Administrator over their Surplus
be freed discharge from any future
liability as such Administrators.
