John Otis Esq: Comissionated by his Excel: The Gouvernor  
 To be Judge of ye Probate of Wills & Granting Administrations within  
 The County of Barnstable: & All to be done These presentes made  
 greeting to Thomas: Administration is made to me the 2<sup>d</sup> of July: of John  
 Rider Esq: late of Plymouth in d<sup>r</sup> County who dyed Intestate and his  
 Estate being apprized Esq: real & personal in a full manner as of 2<sup>d</sup> June 1721:  
 tech and an Inventory thereof exhibited: which in all together with debts  
 due to the Estate amount to Two hundred Sixteen Pounds, fifteen Shillings  
 and four pence. And an account of debts and other charges being apprised  
 to me the 2<sup>d</sup> January instant to the sume of one hundred and six pounds  
 eight shillings to the Estate paid and out of sume on which he o<sup>r</sup> hand charged  
 with owing in the whole i<sup>t</sup> early four pounds five Shillings & four pence  
 there then remains Three hundred fifty two pounds & Ten Shillings  
 to be divided amongst Nine of the children of d<sup>r</sup> Rider: it being made  
 appear to me that John Rider the Eldest son hath had his Due  
 share or portion given to him by his Deceased Father in his life time  
 so that there is to each of d<sup>r</sup> Nine Children Thirty nine pounds three  
 shillings and four pence to a single Person: else so as much as it is  
 represented to me that the Rest Estate of d<sup>r</sup> Rider will not amount to  
 more than one of d<sup>r</sup> his Conveniently. Now Know ye therefore that the d<sup>r</sup>  
 Estate both real & personal is settled by me the d<sup>r</sup> Judge and award to be di-  
 vided in d<sup>r</sup> following manner: That is to say: That d<sup>r</sup> Samuel Rider the  
 second son of d<sup>r</sup> Rider have to him his wife & a son for ever all of Real  
 Estate mentioned in the Inventory: Excepting the Quaker part of the land  
 mill viz The Dwelling House there and Land thereto annexed Enjoying the  
 fifty fifth Part in d<sup>r</sup> d<sup>r</sup> County: and of Sixty Thousand & Hundred and  
 sixteenth Part of Rider's Land other Places in d<sup>r</sup> d<sup>r</sup> County with  
 the appurtenances therof: and one pence of one pound and Two Shillings in a  
 Lot of Land with Joseph Dapell near Godfrey: all being apprised upon  
 oath at Two hundred Thirteen pounds & Sixteen Shillings: he having given  
 Bonds at the sume directed for payment of one hundred Twenty four pounds  
 Twelve Shillings & eight pence being the remaining part of what his  
 own single share does not amount to; out of which money together  
 with the sume of one hundred & one pound & the remainder of d<sup>r</sup> Rider's Estate: of  
 other eight younger children of d<sup>r</sup> Rider viz: Nehemiah Rider: Esther  
 Smith: Mary Dyer: Sarah Rider: Nath<sup>e</sup> Rider: Hannah Rider: Jacob  
 Rider: & Martha Rider: an each of them to have Thirty nine pounds  
 Three Shillings and four pence a pence to be paid to them by d<sup>r</sup> Sam<sup>e</sup>
