

William A. Shepherd dec'd Will

Be it remembered that on the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of May AD 1871 at the Probate Court held in the Court House at Wilmington Clinton County Ohio Before John Matthews Judge of the said Court for Probate a paper purporting to be the Last Will and Testament of William A. Shepherd late of Clinton County Ohio deceased and thereupon came Joseph A. Gravatt and H. B. Powell the subscribing witnesses to said Will and being first duly sworn by the Judge of said Court testified to the due execution thereof which testimony was reduced to writing and by their respective subscribers and filed with said will and the Court being satisfied that said Will was duly executed and that at the time of the execution thereof said Testator was of full age and of sound and disposing mind and memory and under no undue or unlawful restraint It is therefore ordered by the Court that said Will be and it is hereby admitted to Probate and ordered to be Recorded with said Testimony

In the name of the Benevolent Father of all:  
I, William A. Shepherd of the County of Clinton Ohio,  
do make and publish this my last Will and Testament  
Item, I desire that my just debts and all charges be paid out of my Estate

Item, I devise and bequeath all the residue of my property real and personal to my wife Francis A. Shepherd, to be her and her heirs forever.

Item, I nominate and appoint my Son George A. Shepherd Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby authorizing and empowering him to compromise adjust release and discharge in such manner as to him shall seem proper the debts and claims due me I also authorize and empower him if it shall become necessary in order to pay my debts to sell by private sale or in such manner upon such terms of credit as otherwise as he may think proper all or any part of my real Estate and deeds to purchasers to execute acknowledge and deliver in fee simple I desire that no appraisement and no sale of my personal property be made unless that the Court of Probate direct the omission of the same in pursuance of the Statute I hereby revoke all former wills by me made
