### Notes for Franklin Melvin ROBINSON:

Frank enlisted twice in the Civil War. He first enrolled in Company B, 135th Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteers. He "enrolled" at Clarington, Pennsylvania on 1 August 1862 and served until May 1863 when he was mustered out. He moved with his family to M innesota. He enlisted in Company G, 7th Regiment, Minnesota Infantry Volunteers on 25 Jan 1864 and was mustered out on 16 August 1865. He "enrolled" this time at St. Paul, Minnesota. His pension records are on file. They say he died in Long Creek, Grant Co., OR. His wife indicates Umatilla Co., OR.

His death is something of a mystery. In 1885 his wife and children were living in Kansas. There is no information to suggest how Frank ended up working in Oregon and dying there. I believe his body was eventually removed to his parents who by this time had moved to the Dakota Territory in what is today Emmons Co., North Dakota

## Notes for Mary Elizabeth CRAIG:

Mary homesteaded land in North Dakota next to her in-laws in on 20 July, 1886. Perhaps she made this decision after Frank's death when she went to North Dakota with her children. She lived in North Dakota for several years and eventually was granted a patent by the US Government (Orig. filed on July 20, 1885). During this time she served as a teacher at the township school. After this she moved back to Wabaunsee County, Kansas for good.

The three brothers, John, Frederick and James were in Indiana in 1860, Missouri in about 1870 and Kansas by 1880.

John Rice Craig was also known as Rice Craig during his lifetime. The following census reports showing some deviation in his age, explains why he was thought at times to be two different people.

Further proof is reflected in the following records:

October 5, 1849--Mercer County Deed Book 26, page 351;

Thomas J. Powell and Harriet his wife sell to John Q. Robertson for \$150, lot # 6 (inherited by Harriet from Joseph Wheat) 12 3/4 acres. The land is bordered by Jackson Randall and Mary Wheat Randall, John Q. and Nancy Wheat Robertson's lot, Joseph Wheat, Melvin Wheat, JOHN R. CRAIG and wife Lucindy Wheat Craig.

March 24, 1851--Mercer County Deed Book 27, page 217; John Q. Robertson and wife Catherine of Owen County, sell to Robert Robertson for \$1500 the 78 acres where he is now living on the waters of Salt River beginning in the middle of the turnpike (now U.S.127) in line with the Cunningham heirs, in a line with the road to Lucto, touching RICE CRAIG's land, being the same land conveyed in part by Caniders (? maybe Kennedys) heirs and in part by Joseph Wheats heirs. (Comment: This must be in the present day area of Wheat School Road--right at the Anderson

County line.) Robert Robertson is listed as age 24 in the 1850 Mercer County Census, so we assume he is a son of John Q. Robertson. He lives three households away from Rice/John Rice Craig, and not so far away is Floyd Gritton who has Mary Craig, age 22, living in his household.

One aspect of the brothers move to Indiana is very muddy. The 1860 Johnson County Census shows there is also a Frederick Craig, age 56, who was born in Kentucky, living a short distance away. The temptation is to think that this is the father of the younger Craig men. However, the ages do not match. Frederick Sr. was born abt 1796 in Garrard County, Kentucky and would be about 65 years of age.

There is another possibility; the Frederick Craig who was the son of William Craig. This Frederick was born about 1807 which would make him the proper age. However, he supposedly died in Putnam County, Indiana at a much earlier date. That conclusion is based upon the will of John W. Craig where an item of the will indicates that property was left to the heirs of Frederick's son. From that the assumption is that Frederick, son of William, is therefore also deceased.

In any case, there is a Frederick Craig mentioned in the 1860 Johnson County, Indiana Census and is shown living not too far from the 3 sons of Frederick. It is highly unlikely the combination of the name Frederick Craig and the proximity to 3 brothers, sons of Frederick, is just an accident. Although it is odd that Frederick Craig would show up so nearby without being related, however, we cannot find the resolution oddity at this time.

John Rice (Rice Craig) and wife Lucinda Wheat Craig are shown with daughter Mary and a Henry Craig, shown as 20 years of age. It is possible that the name was Harvey and that this was one of the many transcription errors of the 1850 census. John R. had a brother Harvey that would have been exactly 20 at the time. Harvey, not yet married may have been living with John R. because his father remarried in 1846, after his wife Lucinda had died.

The census shows John R. (Rice) Craig at age 36 living with his wife Lucinda, 30, and their 3 children; Mary E., age 10; John H., age 5 and James, age 2.

The 2 youngest children are shown as born in Indiana while the others were all shown as born in Kentucky.

### Notes for Lucinda WHEAT:

Lucinda shows up on the 1850 Census as the wife of Rice Craig (John Rice Craig) with a 2 year old daughter Mary. A 20 year old Henry Craig (born about 1830) is living with them. He is probably John's brother.

About this period came from Massachusetts Seymour and Timothy Crittenden, and settled, the former on the farm now occupied by Frank FRENCH, and the latter on the present Troy Conference Academy grounds, his house standing near the sidewalk in front of the academy. Seymour was a prominent member of the Congregational Church, and a Democrat. Among his descendants may be named his grandson, Henry H. CRITTENDEN, a resident of Poultney. Timothy CRITTENDEN sold his farm to Dr. James WITHERELL in 1810 and went west. He represented the town in 1802-03.

The first church in town (Poultney) was the Congregational Church, which was organized in 1780 by Rev. Ithamer HIBBARD, of Bennington, and a chaplain in the army of the Revolution. It is not known who the original members were, but the following were probably among the members in 1795: Samuel LEE, Silas HOWE, Calvin MALLARY, Bazaleel FARNUM, Joel FRISBIE, Barnabus RICHMOND, Timothy CRITTENDEN and Oliver STRONG.

Timothy was a Revolutionary War veteran. He was in the siege of Quebec via lake Champlain.

Sam'l Sr. and Alice established their home on the \_\_\_\_ Road near Highland, later the Charles P. Woodmansee farm and now the Robert Manuel Farm.

Biographical Hist of Scioto Valley (p. 379): Sam'l Woodmansee moved westward to Highland Co, OH in 1819 and shortly after bought 700 acres of land a part of the original Conway Military Survey. Nearly all of the original purchase still being owned by his descendants. Samuel and Alice were marrieed in 1776, the year of the signing of the Dec of Ind. All the Children came to Ohio at varioous times except Penelope, Hannah and Lydia, all of whom married in New Jersey. Phoebe married Dr. Conway, a desc of Joseph Conway, the original owner of the "Conway Grant." GW Woodmansee has in his possession the original patent to 2400 acres of land given by the government to Lt. Joseph Conway. The Patent states that the land was given in acknowledgement of seven years of service rendered in the Revolutionary War by Lt. Joseph Conway, written on parchment made from the skin of a sheep, dated at Philadelphia Aug 1790, signed by John Adams.

Hist of Ross and Highland Counties, Ohio (p. 403): The Woodmansee family was first represented in the Township in 1818. Sam'l Woodmansee and his wife Alice Jeffrey came in that eyar form Monmouth Co, NJ and settled where Charles P. Woodmansee now lives, and a number of children came in later years. Samuel woodmansee died in 1837 at the age of 83. Will

Jamie Young: A deed dated 20 Apr 1787 lists Elsie (Alice) Woodmancy (sister), Catherine Reed (sister), and Mary Jeffrey (mother) to John Jeffrey 400 Acres in Dover, Southside Toms River, joining Good Luck etc. This deed would positively tie Alice to Francis Jeffrey, who married Mary Longstreet. Most data on ancestors stems from this source.

Many factors have conspired to make researching any Craig Line a difficult task. The repeated use of names like, John, William, Westley, Elijah, and Elizabeth (etc.) are only the start. The geographic proximity of similarly named family groups that seemed to move across the frontier, in unison, is another problem. Many insisted that our line and the TOLIVER line of Craigs had to be connected. Family tradition and historical records have our Craigs in the area of Bryan's Station, Harrodsburg and other forts along the Kentucky River where many of the Toliver line were also recorded.

The condition of this obligation is such that whereas there is a Marriage shortly intended to be solemnized between John Craig & Elizabeth Huffman.

If therefore there shall be no lawful cause to obstruct the said marriage then the above obligation to void or else remain in full force.

Jessamine County Tax lists of 1806 through 1813 indicate that William moved from Garrard and showed up on that Counties tax rolls in 1806. He was on the 1810 Jessamine Co Ky Census. He was still there in 1813.

The Jessamine County Census of 1810 show William and Peggy with 2 males under age 10 (Frederick and John) one male 16 to 26 and one female 16 to 26 (William and his wife who were still under 26)

The is significant because it indicates that both John and Frederick were born earlier than 1810 but NOT BEFORE 1800. The marriage of William and Peggy in April of 1805 further indicates that the range of their birth dates is limited to the 1806 - 1810 time frame. John was born first and indications are that he was be born in either 1806 or 1807. Frederick is thought to have been born in 1807/08 time frame. These dates are critical when researching John's branch of our family tree, later on, in Edgar County, Illinois.

Sometime after 1813 William and family moved to Putnam County, Indiana and appeared to remain there until after the 1830 Census. We also find the Dorrells there, in Putnam County. However, by 1832, when his will was probated, William, Peggy and some of their children appear to have moved on to Paris, Edgar County, Illinois. William had land upon which there was a large mill that was mentioned in his will. Upon Williams death the family seemed to split and go in many directions, some had married and stayed in Indiana, some stayed in Illinois, others headed west and a few returned to their prior home in Kentucky. Of key significance is the fact that Lindsey (David Lindsey) returned to Kentucky, since he is one of the forefathers of our line and his later marriage to Mary Jane Robertson is an important element in the way our family history plays out.

His place of birth is based on the fact that John was listed on the Rockbridge County tax rolls and the family did not move to Kentucky until 1791.

I William Craig of Edgar County and State of Illinois being weak in body but of sound mind and memory and feeling the necessity that every man should so arrange his business as to give as little trouble to his heirs as possible feels it necessary and doth make make this my last will and testimony in the manner following.viz

Item 1st, as the mill tract and (? Slu) would go to decay, as one third of said property belongs to John Craig my son, I wish the said property to be sold and as it is agreed that the whole should be sold to the highest bidder, one hundred dollars to be paid by the 1st day of April next, the balance to be paid as follows; the one (?) 1834, the other half to be paid in one year from that date, also all my stock, household and kitchen furniture, farming utensils do I will that they shall be sold on a credit of twelve months from the day of the sale with the exception of one bed and bedding which I bequeath to my daughter Polly also my saddle I leave to Linsey (Lindsay) my son also the colt which he claims, to my son William I require that he shall have the amount of the sucking colt or the price that it may bring extra. To my daughter Mariah I request that she may have twelve dollars extra, to James I leave ten dollars extra also to Polly (Mary) forty five dollars extra, the balance after all my just debts shall be satisfied I request and wish to be divided as follows between John, Polly, Linsey, William, James, Mariah, Wesley (John Westley) and Tilford (Daniel T.) my heirs it is also my wish in the division that Frederick Craig deceased that his son shall have a part of as fifty dollars is to one hundred and to that proportion. I also request that John Craig and Robert Gill shall be and they are hereby appointed my executors and administrates the within property and effects.

In witness whereof I have sit my hand and affixed my seal this 14th day of September one thousand eight hundred and thirty two 1832.

Rev. Henry Miller Cox avows that Isaac Cox was born in 1822, and further states that another source places his date of birth at 1824, while Evelyn C. Adams listed his dates at "(1716?-1783)." In all my research, Colonel Isaac Cox was definitely the leader in this Cox family; thus, I have decided to go along with Evelyn C. Adams' approximate date of birth, yet, the records uncovered in Wheeling, West Virginia, indicate that Colonel Isaac Cox died in 1794, as stated by Rev. Henry Miller Cox. Mrs. Adams was going by the date that Colonel Isaac Cox made out his will, which was not the actual date of his death. The 1794 date, is recorded as the date that his will was read, thus, the date of his death was probably that same year.

"Isaac's sixth son George said that he was born in Maryland in 1748, but grew up in Hampshire County, [Virginia].8"

NOTE: The Cox family removed, about 1750, to a section of Frederick County, Virginia, that was organized as Hampshire County in 1753. Thus, all children born, prior to 1750, were born in Switzerland, Maryland, or Cox's Fort, Baltimore Co., MD. There is good evidence that the "Cox's Fort" was built near what was to be known (after the border disputes between Pennsylvania, Maryland, and Virginia), as the Mason-Dixon Line, in what we know today, as Harford Co., Maryland.

A Rockbridge County Tithes List shows our John Craige (John Craig Sr.) in 1778, and John Jr (W.) Craig shows up in 1785. At present, nothing is known of their where-abouts prior to that.

Rockbridge County Va. was formed from Botetourt and Augusta Counties in 1778. Botetourt was formed in 1770 from Augusta, then split in 1778. In 1737, John Lewis, a native of Dublin Co., Ireland, secured a grant of land (Borden's Grant) covering half of what is now Rockbridge Co. In 1737, Bordens Grant was in Orange County (it now lies within Rockbridge County). To settle-up and secure the land he, brought in around one hundred families from Scotland, the border counties of England and the north of Ireland

This is documented by a marriage bond recorded in 1778 in Rockbridge County, Virginia (Marriage Bond - Mary Craig & Wm. Groves). The brides parents are recorded on the bond, as John & Elizabeth Craige. William Groves died in 1793, leaving Mary to raise their son John Groves.

Rockbridge County Tax lists for 1783 and 1785 show Mary Groves with one horse and one cow. In 1785 the widow Groves then married, in Rockbridge County Virginia, one Daniel C. Miller. (Records show a Marriage Bond for "Mary Graves - widow"; John Craige signs it in 1785 in Rockbridge County.) Daniel C. Miller died in 1790, leaving Mary a widow once again.

Mary Craig Groves Miller then married Robert Martin in 1791, and they moved to Summersville, West Virginia. Mary died there, in 1830 and is buried in the Miller Cemetery at Kessler Cross Lanes, near Summersville, West Virginia.

James Wright was born in 1671. The following is quoted from a book on Quaker ministers: "James

Wright, an elder of the Hopewell monthly meeting, was one of the first settlers in that part of Virginia. He was a sober, honest man, grave in manners, and solid and weighty in his conversation. He was diligent in the attendance of his religious meetings, exemplary in humble waiting therein, and of sound mind and judgment. He was cautious of giving just offence to any one, and was earnestly concerned for the unity of the brethren, and the peach of the church. He appeared, say his friends, concerned him, for some time before his illness, as one who had finished his day's work, and who was waiting for his change. He was 83 years old when he died." The parents of James have not been confirmed and there are multiple reports on where he was born. James married Mary Bowater, daughter of John Bowater and Mary Maunder on Feb. 26, 1706 in East Nottingham, Chester, PA. Note that a Mary Davis is often listed as the mother of John, but Stewart Baldwin in the American Genealogist has determined that Mary Bowater must be the spouse to James Wright Sr. because of their being witnesses at different weddings of both sides of the family and other Bowater being witnesses at weddings of their children.

## Notes for Mary Bowater:

Mary's last name has oft been printed as Davis of Welsh descent. (C-273, 972,999) Mary Davis was from Manoaken, Somerset, Maryland. According to Farmer, the lineage goes back through James Davis, a founder of Jamestown. Farmer says her birthdate was Mar. 16, 1674 and her marriage was Dec. 2, 1689. This birthdate aligns with the other children of her supposed parents, James and Margeret Davis, and in no way aligns with the published Quaker birthdate for Mary Wright in Hopewell records. It also has no first hand support other than a family group sheet that states her name and dates came from "Records of the Society of Friends, Swarthmore College, Swarthmore, Penn in 1908." (C-956)

This oft printed theory and incongruous lineage in as reputable a source as Farmer, has now effectively been disproven by Stewart Baldwin in "The American Genealogist", July/Oct. 1997 issue. She was a Bowater based on multiple pieces of evidence. Mary Wright's birthdate is listed in Feb. 12, 1689 in Hopewell Quaker records. This is off by a 1 day from being Mary Bowater's actual birthdate in English records if the 1689 date is interpreted as 1688/1689. As an orphaned young woman, Mary Bowater was received on certificate from England to live near her brother, Thomas in the Philadelphia Monthly Meeting records dated 28 4th month 1706. This is the only time she is mentioned in this country under her maiden name. By 26 11th mo 1708/9 in Philadelphia records Mary condemed her marriage as contrary to discipline. This record coincides with the estimated marriage date for Mary and James Wright. Although the Quaker records were destroyed for the time period of their marriage, later marriage records of Mary and James Wright's children include many Bowater relatives as witnesses and do not include any Davis relatives. Mary and James Wright were also listed in the relatives column for her brother, Thomas Bowater's daughter's marriage. Lastly, they have a grandson named Bowater. Stewart Baldwin's case that Mary is a Bowater is actually one of the finest pieces of genealogical analysis I've seen. (C-999)

Her will is as follows: "I, Mary Wright, of Frederick County in the Colony of Virginia, being aged and sickly but of a sound and well disposing mind and memory do make this my last will and testament hereby revoking and disanulling all other wills that have heretofore been made or done by me. First, my will is that my body be decently buried and that all my just debts and funeral charges that I leave to be defrayed at the discretion of my executors hereafter named. Secondly, I give and bequeath and demise to the proper use and behalf of him the said Thomas Wright his heirs and assigns forever. Thirdly, I give and bequeath all and singular of my wearing apparel unto my seven daughters, vis., Mary, Hannah, Martha, Elizabeth, Ann, Sarah, Lidia to be equally divided among them, Fourthly, I give and begueath to my daughter Sarah Pickering, one brass mortar, Fifthly, I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Wright all and singular of my stock and household goods. I also will that what money remains after my decease, from the land sold on Middlefork is to be equally divided among my ten children, vis. James, Isaac, Mary Hannah, Martha, Elizabeth, Ann, Sarah, Lydia and John. Lastly, I ordain and constitute my well beloved daughter, Mary Ballinger, Jesse Pugh and William Pickering sole executors of this my last will and testament as witness my hand and seal this 5th day of the 8th month, 1760. Signed, sealed and acknowledged by the said Mary Wright to be her last will and testament in presence of us. Signed: Mary Wright Witness: Elizabeth Powell, Elinor Rogers, Susanna Bevin. (This was proved March 6, 1764 in Frederick Co., VA)

Olof Stille was born on the island of Solö in Roslagen, northeast of Stockholm, the son of Per Stille, a relatively prosperous supervisor of the Penningby estate in Länna parish. By 1627 Per Stille had retired and was granted land by the owners of Penningby on a nearby island called Humblö. Here Olof Stille married and began his family. Although Olof Stille was on good terms with Erik Bielke, who inherited Penningby in 1629, he did not think well of Bielke's wife, Catarina Fleming.

At the Norrtälje fair in 1636, Olof Stille indiscreetly voiced his opinion of Lady Catarina Fleming, who retaliated by prosecuting Olof for defamation and took his property at Humblö. When Olof refused to leave the island, he was imprisoned. After securing his freedom, Olof and his family resettled in Matsunda, where he was joined by one of his former servants named Anders. Lady Fleming, now a widow, had Anders seized on 18 March 1638 and imprisoned at Penningby under the claim that Anders had broken a verbal agreement with the late Lord Bielke to be their servant.

Olof Stille heard the news the next day, entered Penningby Castle by a secret door, broke the lock to the dungeon with his axe and then fled, with Anders carrying the axe and Olof his own rapier. On complaint from Lady Fleming, the Governor issued an order for Olof Stille's arrest on 28 March 1638 - the same day that the first expedition to New Sweden was landing at the Rocks. At the trial on 13 April 1638 Olof Stille was convicted of burglary and sentenced to death by the sword. The appellate court, however, modified the sentence to a fine of 100 daler silver money, the equivalent of 17 months pay for a New Sweden soldier.

Three years later, in May 1641, when the Charitas departed for New Sweden, the passenger list included Olof Stille, a mill-maker, his wife, a daughter aged 7 and a son aged 11/2. Also on board were Olof's younger brother Axel Stille, and the family of Måns Svensson Lom, whose wife appears to have been Olof's younger sister. His older brother, Johan Stille, later pastor at Fundbo, 1644-1672, and his sister Kerstin remained in Sweden.

In New Sweden, Olof Stille settled as a freeman at a place called Techoherassi by the Indians, located between present Crum Creek and Ridley Creek (called Olof Stille's Creek). Joining him at this location were his brother Axel Stille and the Lom family. The Indians were frequent visitors to Techoherassi and liked Olof Stille very much, but they considered his heavy, black beard a monstrosity and conferred a strange name on him because of it.

As the only known mill-maker in the colony, Olof Stille probably was in charge of building the first Swedish gristmill on Mill (now Cobbs) Creek. He also became a leader among the freemen and played a key role in promoting the July 1653 list of grievances, signed by Olof Stille and 21 other freemen, which was submitted to Governor Johan Printz, protesting his dictatorial rule. Printz labeled this action mutiny and promptly left for Sweden. To Olof Stille, however, it was simply exercising the right of free speech. When Governor Rising arrived, Olof asked for a prompt trial. Rising, who took a more kindly view toward the freeman, let the matter drop.

After the surrender of New Sweden, the Dutch governor, Petrus Stuyvesant, agreed to allow the Swedes and Finns living north of the Christina River to govern themselves. The first Swedish court, organized in 1656, had Olof Stille as its chief justice and also included Peter Larsson Cock, Peter Gunnarsson Rambo and Matts Hansson from Borgå, Finland.

During his eight years as chief justice of the Swedes' court, there were frequent policy clashes between the Swedes and the Dutch. Olof Stille proved himself to be an able defender of the Swedes' position and usually prevailed.

Retiring as chief justice in 1664, Olof Stille moved to Moyamensing (later south Philadelphia) with Lars Andersson Collinus (who had married Måns Lom's widow) and his son-in-law Marten Roosemond. Even in retirement, he was called upon to arbitrate disputes among the settlers. He died about 1684. He was survived by his brother Axel Stille, who had no children, and four children who have been identified:

Ella Stille, born in 1634 in Roslagen, married twice. By her first husband, Peter Jochimsson, she had two children, Peter Petersson Yocum, born 1652, and Elisabeth Petersdotter, born 1654, who married John Ogle, an English soldier. By her second marriage to Hans Månsson, she had six more sons, originally known by the patronymic Hansson but later adopting the surname of Steelman. They were John, Jöns (James), Christiern, Peter, Charles and Eric. Ella died in 1718 in Gloucester County NJ.

Anders Stille, born in 1640 in Roslagen, moved to New Castle about 1658 and married there, by 1671, Annetje Pieters, daughter of the Dutch brewer, Pieter Wolfertsen van Couwenhoven. Soon after his marriage, he moved to Christina Creek, taking up residence next to his niece, Elisabeth Petersdotter Ogle. Later, they moved to White Clay Creek in New Castle County, where he died between 1688 and 1692, survived by two sons, John and Jacob, and one daughter thus far identified, Elisabeth, who married Charles Hedges.

Christina Stille, born in America c. 1643, became the second wife of Marten Roosemond, a Dutch "cleinsmit" (toolmaker), who moved from New Castle to Moyamensing after his marriage. Two landmarks on that property were named Roosemond Creek and Hollanders Creek. Roosemond returned to New Castle before 1671 and served as judge on the New Castle court and deacon of the Dutch church there until his death in 1677. It is unknown whether Christina had any children. Johan Stille, born in America in 1646, married about 1683 Gertrude, daughter of Mårten Gerritsen and Christina Lom of New Castle County. They had twelve children: Christina (born 1684), Anna (1685), Olof [William] (1687), Sarah (1690), John (1692), Brigitta (1693), Barbara (1697), Peter (1699), Gertrude (1701), Morton (1704), Helena (1705) and Allemisha (1709). Johan Stille inherited the Moyamensing plantation, where he died in 1722. His widow died in 1744.

Among the many soldiers accompanying Governor Printz on the Fourth Expedition to New Sweden was Joen Nilsson of Skåning hundred, Skaraborg län, who was later better known under the name of Jonas Nilsson. Born in 1620, Jonas, a tailor by trade, started his voyage to New Sweden from Stockholm in September 1642. After arriving at Fort Christina, 15 February 1643, he was one of many men assigned to help build Fort Elfsborg, where he was subsequently stationed. He was listed on the passenger list as a soldier.

Thomas Gregson arrived in Boston, MA, from London, 26 June 1637, in company with Mr. Theophilus Eaton and Rev. John Davenport, going with their party to settle New Haven Colony. He came of an old and gentle Derbyshire family, and was one of the most active and useful settlers of the New Haven Colony. Winthrop wrote that "he was probably the chief man in the Colony after Governor Eaton." His home was on the east side of the harbor, and "was one of the four which excelled in stateliness all other houses erected in New Haven by the first generation of its inhabitants."

He was an active and successful merchant. He was made freeman in 1640 and a member of the Congregational Church. He served as deputy to the General Court at Boston. From 1640 to 1643 he was judge of New Haven jurisdiction. He took the oath of fidelity in 1644, with Gov. Eaton and the other planters in New Haven, and was appointed the first treasurer of the colony. The same year he and three other merchants had an ocean-going vessel built. In 1645/6 it sailed for London with a cargo of grain, hides, etc., and Thomas Gregson aboard. He had been appointed colonial agent to Parliament. He was given 200 pounds in good merchantable beaver to defray expenses. The vessel was never heard from. The following June in New Haven, many persons saw in the air an apparition of a ship, which was taken to be the lost one, and this incident was the inspiration of Longfellow's poem, The Phantom Ship.

The last will and testament of me James Pennyman of Braintree the 18th of the 10th month [Dec.] 1664. Having my understanding & memory according to the measure god hath given mee I commit my soul into the Hands of the Lord who gave it to mee & through Christ hath Redeemed mee & will eternally save mee. First all my Debts being Discharged first and the Charge of my Funerall which being Done my mooveable Estate I thus Dispose of Halfe my uplands halfe my Meadowed halfe my Orchard halfe my Barnes & outhousing and all my Dwelling house I doe give unto my Beloved wife For her support & my Lesser children with her. The other halfe I give unto my sonne Joseph & if he thinke good to Improove it all for his Mothers Comfort upon such termes as his Mother & hee may agree. I thinke it will be best if he marry & build neer my wife shee shall Lett him have which ever part of the Orchard she pleaseth.

My mooveable Estate I Doe also give wholy to my Beloved Wife for her support & the Education of my Lesser Children. And Because god hath blessed mee with many Children: I Doe Commit it to my wifes Discretion to Doe good unto them all in as neer a proportion as shee Canne & to bee most helpfull to them that have most need. and when she finisheth her life w[ha]t remaineth in her hands, either of my Lands or goods she shall be the Best advice she can proportion out unto my Children so as to make them as equall shares as shee Canne.

My first borne James having been educated into such a way of livinge as hee is having already had a portion. I turst in the Lord it will bee such a Blessing as will answer his Double portion.

To my youngest sonne Samuell & my 3 youngest Daughters I give 20 a peice if it bee to bee had at my wifes Decease, or afore if need bee & suchy as are married to be made up to such a sum if it be to be had.

Olof Stille was born on the island of Solö in Roslagen, northeast of Stockholm, the son of Per Stille, a relatively prosperous supervisor of the Penningby estate in Länna parish. By 1627 Per Stille had retired and was granted land by the owners of Penningby on a nearby island called Humblö. Here Olof Stille married and began his family. Although Olof Stille was on good terms with Erik Bielke, who inherited Penningby in 1629, he did not think well of Bielke's wife, Catarina Fleming.

At the Norrtälje fair in 1636, Olof Stille indiscreetly voiced his opinion of Lady Catarina Fleming, who retaliated by prosecuting Olof for defamation and took his property at Humblö. When Olof refused to leave the island, he was imprisoned. After securing his freedom, Olof and his family resettled in Matsunda, where he was joined by one of his former servants named Anders. Lady Fleming, now a widow, had Anders seized on 18 March 1638 and imprisoned at Penningby under the claim that Anders had broken a verbal agreement with the late Lord Bielke to be their servant.

Olof Stille heard the news the next day, entered Penningby Castle by a secret door, broke the lock to the dungeon with his axe and then fled, with Anders carrying the axe and Olof his own rapier. On complaint from Lady Fleming, the Governor issued an order for Olof Stille's arrest on 28 March 1638 - the same day that the first expedition to New Sweden was landing at the Rocks. At the trial on 13 April 1638 Olof Stille was convicted of burglary and sentenced to death by the sword. The appellate court, however, modified the sentence to a fine of 100 daler silver money, the equivalent of 17 months pay for a New Sweden soldier.

Three years later, in May 1641, when the Charitas departed for New Sweden, the passenger list included Olof Stille, a mill-maker, his wife, a daughter aged 7 and a son aged 11/2. Also on board were Olof's younger brother Axel Stille, and the family of Måns Svensson Lom, whose wife appears to have been Olof's younger sister. His older brother, Johan Stille, later pastor at Fundbo, 1644-1672, and his sister Kerstin remained in Sweden.

In New Sweden, Olof Stille settled as a freeman at a place called Techoherassi by the Indians, located between present Crum Creek and Ridley Creek (called Olof Stille's Creek). Joining him at this location were his brother Axel Stille and the Lom family. The Indians were frequent visitors to Techoherassi and liked Olof Stille very much, but they considered his heavy, black beard a monstrosity and conferred a strange name on him because of it.

As the only known mill-maker in the colony, Olof Stille probably was in charge of building the first Swedish gristmill on Mill (now Cobbs) Creek. He also became a leader among the freemen and played a key role in promoting the July 1653 list of grievances, signed by Olof Stille and 21 other freemen, which was submitted to Governor Johan Printz, protesting his dictatorial rule. Printz labeled this action mutiny and promptly left for Sweden. To Olof Stille, however, it was simply exercising the right of free speech. When Governor Rising arrived, Olof asked for a prompt trial. Rising, who took a more kindly view toward the freeman, let the matter drop.

After the surrender of New Sweden, the Dutch governor, Petrus Stuyvesant, agreed to allow the Swedes and Finns living north of the Christina River to govern themselves. The first Swedish court, organized in 1656, had Olof Stille as its chief justice and also included Peter Larsson Cock, Peter Gunnarsson Rambo and Matts Hansson from Borgå, Finland.

During his eight years as chief justice of the Swedes' court, there were frequent policy clashes between the Swedes and the Dutch. Olof Stille proved himself to be an able defender of the Swedes' position and usually prevailed.

Retiring as chief justice in 1664, Olof Stille moved to Moyamensing (later south Philadelphia) with Lars Andersson Collinus (who had married Måns Lom's widow) and his son-in-law Marten Roosemond. Even in retirement, he was called upon to arbitrate disputes among the settlers. He died about 1684. He was survived by his brother Axel Stille, who had no children, and four children who have been identified:

Ella Stille, born in 1634 in Roslagen, married twice. By her first husband, Peter Jochimsson, she had two children, Peter Petersson Yocum, born 1652, and Elisabeth Petersdotter, born 1654, who married John Ogle, an English soldier. By her second marriage to Hans Månsson, she had six more sons, originally known by the patronymic Hansson but later adopting the surname of Steelman. They were John, Jöns (James), Christiern, Peter, Charles and Eric. Ella died in 1718 in Gloucester County NJ.

Anders Stille, born in 1640 in Roslagen, moved to New Castle about 1658 and married there, by 1671, Annetje Pieters, daughter of the Dutch brewer, Pieter Wolfertsen van Couwenhoven. Soon after his marriage, he moved to Christina Creek, taking up residence next to his niece, Elisabeth Petersdotter Ogle. Later, they moved to White Clay Creek in New Castle County, where he died between 1688 and 1692, survived by two sons, John and Jacob, and one daughter thus far identified, Elisabeth, who married Charles Hedges.

Christina Stille, born in America c. 1643, became the second wife of Marten Roosemond, a Dutch "cleinsmit" (toolmaker), who moved from New Castle to Moyamensing after his marriage. Two landmarks on that property were named Roosemond Creek and Hollanders Creek. Roosemond returned to New Castle before 1671 and served as judge on the New Castle court and deacon of the Dutch church there until his death in 1677. It is unknown whether Christina had any children

Johan Stille, born in America in 1646, married about 1683 Gertrude, daughter of Mårten Gerritsen and Christina Lom of New Castle County. Notes for Jarrard SPENCER:

Nothing is known of Jarrard Spencer beyond the fact that he was the father of Garrard Spencer who came to this country. The relationship is established through the will of the former's brother, Richard, proved before the Prerogative Court of Canterbury, London, June 8, 1646. In this will Richard Spencer says:

"I give and bequeath unto Jarrard Spencer, Thomas Spencer, Michael Spencer, sons of my brother Jarrard Spencer deceased, the sum of fifty pounds apiece, and unto the children of William Spencer, son of my said brother Jarrard Spencer deceased, to be divided between them equally, the sum of fifty pounds, to be paid unto their guardians, and within two years next after my decease."

A Michael Spencer came to this country in or before 1635 and was at Lynn in 1638. He died prior to November, 1653. The

Essex County (Mass.) Court records show that he was the nephew of the Richard Spencer of London mentioned above. The same records also prove that Garrard Spencer, our ancestor, was Michael's brother. Consequently, Garrard must also have

been Richard's nephew and the son of Jarrard Spencer, as already stated. Jarrard Spencer must have died before March 17, 1645.

Tristram\* H. Hull prepared a will on 30 December 1666. "Tristram Hull, the second son of the Rev. Joseph Hull, was a man of prominence in Barnstable, where he was chosen Selectman, and served on numerous committees, being empowered to buy land from the Indians, for the improvement of the town, etc. Captain Hull was a 'chip off the old block,' and cared for neither King nor Kaiser, when either interfered with what he wished to do. Colonel Hull, in his pamphlet, gives an interesting account of the manner in which Tristram aided an old church member, who had been fined and banished for 'raising his voice' against Quaker persecution. He picked him up bodily, and carried him off in his own ship as far as Sandwich, on the Cape, in direct violation of the law and contempt of the magistrates. When Captain Hull died he left, besides two fine ships, land, etc., œ1150, 5s, 2d. 4. CAPT. TRISTRAM HULL, 1624-1667, of New England, 2nd son of (1) Rev.Joseph Hull and his wife [?Joanna], was in 1643 residing at Yarmouth, where he was enrolled and mustered in the little army of which Miles Standish was 'Captain-General.' In 1643 he was

married to Blanche (???), and previous to 1648 moved to Barnstable. Evidently he was bred to a sea-faring career, for he owned a ship named The Catch, was part owner of the bark Hopewell, and frequently made long sea voyages. Customs entries show that he was engaged to a considerable extent in trade with the West Indies. Capt. Hull when 'on shore' took a lively interest in local affairs affecting the wellbeing of Barnstable, was treated with special consideration by his fellow townsmen, and unhesitatingly performed the multifarious duties expected in those days of prominent and public spirited citizens. The records of Barnstable show that he frequently served on juries, was one of the town dignitaries appointed to wait upon the Assembly Committee concerning the town charter, took a leading part in the purchase of town lands from the Indians, served one year as constable, and during the last six years of his life was a leading member of the town board of selectmen. In the government's fanatical and inhuman persecution of the Quakers his sympathies were with the latter, and he boldly rendered them assistance and succor whenever and wherever occasion offered. For this he was subjected to much annoyance and heavy fines, but there is nothing to indicate that this made him change his course. In spite of the government's unjust and cruel attitude toward the Quakers, or rather we should doubtless say because of it, several of his children and many of their descendants publicly espoused the Quaker faith, and some of them became prominent leaders in the denomination. Capt. Hull died at Barnstable, leaving a large estate for one of his age and times. His will is dated Dec. 30, 1666, and was proved on Mar. 12, following. In the inventory of his estate we find record, in addition to the lands and ships above mentioned, of 36 head of cattle assessed at 118 pounds, 5 shillings; cash, 105 pounds, and due the estate, exclusive of an undefined amount 'in hands of the Indians,' 300 pounds. His will provides that his son Joseph shall have the homestead and lands attached and six acres more; that his wife Blanche shall have the use of new portion of house and 150 pounds; that his three daughters shall each have 100 pounds; that his son John shall have a certain lot and 30 pounds; that Robert Davis shall have 3 pounds, and that the residuary estate be divided equally, share and share alike, among his wife and children. A short time after his death his widow was married to a Capt. Hedge, who was old enough to have been her father, and from whom she soon separated

We had great difficulty in finding information on Arent Issacsz van Hoeck, but we eventually succeeded. It appears he was living for some time in Amsterdam. He married 1st in Amsterdam (banns published 30 March1652) to Sara van de Cliet (or van de Clid) baptized in Amsterdam 1 May 1629 a daughter of Pieter van de Cliet and Maritje Matthijsdr and married 2nd time in Amsterdam (banns published 29 Jan. 1655 to Geertje Everts, the wife you were referring to in your letters.

Geertje (or officially: Geertruyt) Everts (a patronymical name) was baptized in Amsterdam 19 Jan.1631. She was a daughter of Evert Claesz and Ariaantje Reyners. It turned out Arent, a shoemaker's helper, didn't come from Hoeck in the province of Zeeland as was supposed up till now but hailed from Hooksiel in the former county of Oldenburg, Germany. According to the banns publication in1652, Arent was born there approx. 1623 and on Jan. 19th 1652 Arent (from"Hookseil") was admitted as a citizen of Amsterdam.

In the absence of any Midwout records earlier that 1659, we cannot state postitively the names of these officers. We know that Adriaen Hegeman was appointed a local magistrate in 1654, and find his name on the earliest record of the village as serving still in the capacity of schepen. It is therefore reasonable to presume that the other men, whose names are found with his on the record of July 2, 1959, were appointed schepens with him in 1654. If this is correct, then the first three local magistrates of Midwout were Adriaen Hegeman, Willem Van Boerum, Jan Sueberingh."

Jan and Adrinna were members of the RDC, Midwout, until 1681 when they removed to Bergen NJ. Adrinna died before 1702; Jan married (2) Aeltje (unknown).

### Notes for David PROVOOST:

Here is an example of what can be found in the court record on Jan Jansen Damen. This minor entry gives a good insight into his character and to the culture of the early Dutch colony. There are only a few hundred people in Manhattan in 1640. Life is tenuous, but still remarkably organized. In spite of the passage of over 360 years and being translated, the economy of language of this declaration retains its fundamental moral force. A child has been orphaned, and Jan Jansen Damen and David Provoost pledge to the court to be his guardians.

"We the undersigned, David Provoost and Jan Jansen Damen, chosen this day guardians of Jan van Vorst, promise as honest and honorable men that we shall administer and dispose of the means, effects and patrimony of the aforesaid Jan van Vorst as faithful and upright guardians are bound to do with property of orphans. Furthermore, that we shall use our diligence to collect all debts and claims which the aforesaid Jan van Vorst may have elsewhere; that, as guardians, we shall earnestly take the same in hand and prosecute and argue his case before all courts, judges and justices to final determination, whether as plaintiffs or defendants. For which we bind our persons and property, movable and immovable, present and future, without any exception. Done this 27th of January 1640.

In 1634 she married Abraham Ver Planck. Abraham may have just arrived that year [he was possibly a cousin of J.A. Planck, who witnessed the antenuptial agreement above]. Maria and Abraham lived at the Vigne household until Damen took over. They bought land across the Hudson at Paulus Hook [now Jersey City]. They had a farm and two cows, and leased four acres to two tobacco planters.

The 1643 Indian war forced Maria and Abraham to seek the safety of the fort at Manhattan. The family continued to own the land at Paulus Hook until 1699, but never went back there to live. They bought a lot from brother-in-law Van Tienhoven at Smits VIy in 1649, near Pearl Street and Maiden Lane, and built a house there. They no longer farmed, but leased their land holdings and entered into the fur trade. This business took Abraham up the Hudson and down to the Delaware River. In 1664, when the English fleet showed up on the Hudson River, Abraham was one of the signers of the petition requesting that Peter Stuyvesant surrender. A fight with the English would have destroyed New Amsterdam. The people were more interested in keeping their homes than keeping Stuyvesant as their leader. He fell onto financial hard times in the 1680's, although he still owned lots in New York City which his heirs sold in a 1699 indenture. Maria died in 1689, and Abraham in 1691. His house lot was on Kent-street, the 3d. south of Greenfield lane. He had also lands at Long marsh: and lands also in 1640, on the east side of the North River, below Gravelly beach."

Nathaniel arrived in New England in 1634 in the ship Hercules, of Dover, with his wife and children (Joseph, Mary, Sarah, Judith, Lydia, Stephen, and Thomas), and the following, who came under the designation of 'servants:' Thomas Lapham, George Sutton, Edward Ford, Edward Jenkins, James Bennett, Sarah Couchman, and Mary Perien. The Rev. William Witherell came on this same boat.

"Nathaniel Tilden was among the earliest of the 'Men of Kent' who established plantations at Satuit before 1628, others being Anthony Annable, Thomas Bird, Edward Foster, William Gillson, Henry Merritt, Henry Rowley, Nathaniel Tilden, and Deane says, 'perhaps others.'"7

Nathaniel was a Magistrate in Tenterden, and elected to the office of Mayor.

"Elder Nath'l Tilden was the ancestor of nearly all the Tildens in Marshfield. He was one of three borothers, and they were called 'Men of Kent,' from ENgland. He came to Scitaute at that portion called 'Tow Mile' tract, now known as North Marshfield, in 1628. His farm extended both sides of North River, part of it being on 'Gravelly beach.'"

Nathaniel came in the Hercules in 1635 from Sandwich, in Co. Kent, being one of an old family at Tenterden, near Cranbrook, in that shire, bringing wife Lydia, seven children and seven servan ts. He may have visited our country before and went home to bring his household; but it does not appear by any facts. He settled in Scituate. In May 1637, with his friend Hatherly, he was appointed by Plymouth Colony to settle the bounds between it and the Massachusetts Colony. He was ruling elder in the church and died 1641, the inventory being of 31 July, and his will of 25 May preceding in that year. It names his wife Lydia, perhaps daughter of Thomas Bourne of Marshfield, yet married in England to which he gives his home at Tenterden, all the seven children Joseph; Thomas, b. a. 1621; Mary, the w. of Thomas Lapham, m. 13 Mar. 1637; Sarah, the w. of George Sutton; Judith; Lydia; and Stephen; also two servants who should serve his eldest son

In 1620 he entered Heidelberg University as a student of divinity. After graduating, he served in various localities in the Netherlands until 1635. He then applied for service overseas and was selected to be sent to the West Indies. A large expedition to Brazil was being prepared and in Jan 1637, he landed at his new post on the Recif of Permanbuco, Brazil. There he was in care of the spiritual needs of the settlers and soldiers. In 1638 he went with those sent to colonize the island of Itamarca, adjacent to Recif. Due to civil unrest, he was forced to return to Recif in 1647/48. By 1654, the Dutch administration in Brazil had become inefficient and corrupt. The Portuguese revolted and the Dutch were given three months to either depart or embrace the Roman Catholic faith and become Portuguese citizens. In April of 1654, the Dutch Protestants with others were evacuated; for some reason not known, Catherina and four children, took a different ship than that of her husband, Rev. Polhemus. She and the children arrived safely in Holland. The ship on which Rev. Polhemus sailed was captured by a Spanish privateer, which in turn was captured by a French Man-of-War, the ship St. Charles. He arrived at New Amsterdam in Sep 1654. This family was separated for two and a half years before Catherine and the children finally arrived in America in Sep 1656.

Wilhelmus Provoost was baptized 12 January 1572 in Antwerp, Flanders, Belgium, the son of Ghiliam Provoost and Maeijken Stevens. Wilhelmus had two older half-sisters, Maijcken and Elijsabeth Provoost, four older sisters, Anna, Margareta (probably died young), Margareta, and Katherina, two younger sisters, Sara and Esther, and one younger brother, Adam. Wilhelmus married Jenne Eerdewijns 2 Mar 1603 in the Waals Hervormde Kerk (Walloon Reformed Church), Dordrecht, South Holland, Netherlands. Jenne was born about 1580 in Antwerp, Flanders, Belgium to Elias Eerdewijns and Jenneken Colpijns. Both Wilhelmus and Jenne had died before the marriage of their daughter, Janneke, in 1641.

#### Footnotes

[1] No records have been found where Gillis uses the name Ten Waert. However, David Provoost in his 1749 manuscript called the family Ten Waert. In addition, a Lambert van Baerle and Barbara Tangweert had a child baptized 18 Sep 1635. This is Lambertus Barleus and Barbara Jelis. Also a Cornelia Tangweert appears as a witness at the 13 Jun 1638 baptism at the Oudekerk of Anna, the daughter of Lambertus and Barbara. Tangweert would have been the 17th-century Amsterdam pronunciaton of Ten Waert. Finally, the New Amsterdam baptismal record shows: "1650, 18 Sept; (Parents) Johan de La Montagne; (Child) Gillis; (Witnesses) Olof Stephenszen Van Courtlt., Grietie ten Waert" Also note that Gillis Ten Waert is sometimes attributed as being the same person as Gillis Verbrugge (or Van Brugh). However, Gillis Ten Waert's daughters, Barbara and Cornelia, mention in their marriage records that their parents are not alive. This means Gillis must have died before 30 Oct 1633.

There is, however, a 20 Mar 1663 court record in New Amsterdam (see Fernow, vol. IV, pgs. 215-6) where the curators of the estate of Gillis van Brugh demand a mortgage payment from Jacob van Couwenhoven. The mortgage agreement, the record reports, was entered into 25 Jan 1657 between Gillis and Jacob. Therefore, Gillis Ten Waert and Gillis Verbrugge are two separate persons.

[2] Mr. Slok included the text but not the date of the marriage record. He, however, mentioned that Gillis was born 1581. Since there are no extant baptismal records in Amsterdam at the time, he probably calculated Gillis' birth date from the marriage record where Gillis is recorded as being age 26. I calculated Beijken's birth date as 1583 as she was recorded as being age 24 at her marriage.

Notes for Guleyn Vigne:

WALLOONS, VALENCIENNES AND LEIDEN

The Walloons were French-speaking Protestants from the southern Netherlands region that is now Belgium and northern France. In the 1500's and 1600's it was subjected to protracted wars involving Holland, France and Spain. A 12-year truce beginning in 1609 provided some respite, but the truce was not renewed when it expired in 1621. Another unsettling factor in that region was the desire of the Catholic French monarchy to convert or kill the Protestant population living within and along its borders. Many non-Catholics fled after having their property confiscated.

Guillaume and Adrienne were born in Valenciennes about 1586-1590. They married sometime around 1610, and emigrated to Holland by 1623. In that year they were in the city of Leiden, which was a protective and tolerant haven from war and prejudice. After they began living among the Dutch, the Vigne name was changed to Vienje. Guillaume became known as Willem Vienje and Adrienne as Ariantje Vienje. [The "-je" ending in the Dutch version of their name was also pronounced as "-yeh."]

# WHY DID THEY GO TO AMERICA?

The Vignes were one of 30 Walloon families selected by the Dutch West India Company to establish a permanent settlement in New Netherlands [New York, New Jersey, Delaware and Connecticut]. The original Company plan was to send only five or six men to set up a fur trading

post on Manhattan Island. The addition of the Walloon families may have been a late change to the plans. Perhaps the families volunteered when they heard of the colonization plans. After all, the Walloons were a displaced people who had become refugees in crowded little Holland. There was no land available to them - the Dutch had run out of land and had just started to reclaim land from the sea. It is possible that Adrienne and Guillaume may have had advance information about the New Netherlands region, according to the "New Netherlands Connections" published by Dorothy A. Koenig:

"Nancy Fulkerson Hill wrote to the Algemeen Rijksarchief in the Hague [to find] whatever documents exist in The Netherlands about the ship Tijger [Tiger] known to be in New Netherland waters in 1614 under the command of Adriaen Block...[they referred her] to notarial documents held by the Gemeentearchief in Amsterdam."

"Pim Nieuwenhuis investigated these notarial documents only to discover that they had already been translated into English and published in 1959 by the City of Amsterdam Press under the title, The Prehistory of the New Netherland Company: Amsterdam Notarial Records of the First Dutch Voyages to the Hudson by Simon Hart ..."

On page 22 Dr. Hart asks rhetorically, Who were the merchants in the [Van Tweenhuysen Company] which sent Adriaen Block on his voyages? Besides Arnout Vogels and Francoys Pelgrom, there were Leonard, Paulus and Steffan Pelgrom -- brothers of Francoys ... [The] four Pelgrom brothers were children of Gheeraert Pelgrom ...[whose] first wife Anthonia van Dijcke died...[and who]... remarried to Susanna Cuvelier. From this marriage Paulus and Steffan Pelgrom were born..."

If Adrienne Cuvelier was related to Susanna Cuvelier, she and Guillaume could have had first-hand information about the DWIC's New Netherland settlement plans through her relatives.

## ATLANTIC CROSSING

The Vignes are believed to have sailed from Holland in April of 1624 on the "Nieuw Nederlandt" [or possibly on the "Eendracht," which means "Unity"]. Some of the other colonists, including Joris Janszen Rapaelje, were also from Valenciennes. The Vignes had three daughters, Christine, Maria and Rachel, when they sailed to America. Most of the 30 families must have had children, as the total number of new colonists was about 120. Upon reaching the Hudson River in mid-May, they found a French ship that was trying to claim the territory for the king of France. With the help of a smaller Dutch ship that arrived from the West Indies, they politely aimed their cannons and escorted the French ship out to sea. Cornelis May, captain of the "Nieuw Nederlandt," became the first Director of the New Netherlands colony.

# FIRST SETTLEMENTS

Eight men were left at Manhattan to "take possession." A dozen families were deposited at the Delaware and Connecticut Rivers, and 18 families were taken up the Hudson to a site near present-day Albany. The first news back to Holland was that, "Everything was in good condition. The colony began to advance bravely, and to live in friendship with the natives." However, most of the families began their residence in the new land by digging seven feet into the ground to make wood-lined, bark covered shelters. They did not begin to build wooden homes until 1625. We don't know whether the Vignes spent their first year at the Albany, Connecticut River or Delaware River settlements.

In 1625, the Company sent over another ship with 103 head of cattle and off-loaded them on Manhattan Island. Along with the cattle came some home builders and more settlers, who were directed to establish six bouweries [farms] on Manhattan. Engineers began constructing Fort Amsterdam near the southern tip of the island, and laying out the streets for the town of New Amsterdam. The colonists who had been deposited at the Connecticut and Delaware Rivers were brought back to Manhattan Island. They were too few in number to be in such isolated locations. Over the next three years, all of the Albany settlers trickled back to Manhattan. In 1626 Peter Minuit [also a Walloon] arrived as the new Director. He brought more colonists and bought the rest of Manhattan Island from the Indians for 60 guilders' worth of minor trade items. By the end of 1628

there were roughly 275 people in and around New Amsterdam.

The Vignes established their Manhattan farm north of what is now Wall Street, along the East River. In 1624 or 1625, not long after their arrival, their son Jan was born. He was the first European male born in New Netherlands. [The first European girl born in New Netherlands was Sara Rapaelje, in June 1625.] Guillaume died about 1632. His two oldest daughters had already married by that time, Christine to Dirck Volckertszen, and Maria to Jan Roos. He left his wife with two minor children.

Article about the 375th anniversary of the 1st Dutch Ships to America

The Nieuw Nederland sailed on or after March 30, 1624. Philippe du Trieux had a certificate from Amsterdam's Walloon Church on March 11, □pourWes Inde,□and this has to be the vessel that brought him to New Netherland, probably accompanied by his second wife Susanne du Chesne, and his children Philippe and Marie.[4]

Although we do not have a Netherlands record regarding the departure of Ghislain and Adrienne (Cuvellier) Vigne and their children Marie, Christine, and Rachel, they certainly were on one of these vessels, as their son Jan would be the first male child born in the new colony, or at least the first male child who survived and remained there (Sara Rapalje was the first female child born in New Netherland).

By the time the Nieuw Netherland sailed the Company had drawn up regulations to govern the new settlements. These are printed (in Dutch and English) in A. J. F. van Laer, ed., Documents Relating to New Netherland 1624-1626 (1924). The final sections of the regulations read:  $\square$ [20]Finally, they shall take the oath of allegiance and obedience to the High and Mighty Lords the States General and to this Company, and shall in all things comport themselves as good and loyal subjects are bound to do. [21] The foregoing articles having been read to the colonists going over in the ship 'Nieu Nederlant,' they took the oath of allegiance this 30th day of March, anno 1624.

# Notes for Ariaentje Cuvilje:

I've seen the name spelled a number of ways. Here is one: Airientje Cuvulje. Also see: "National Gen Soc Qtrly" XXXV/3, Sept. 1947 p-65/69 carries article 'Ariaentje Cuvillje (Adrienne Cuvellier) Matriarch of New Amsterdam' by HF Seversmith citing family problems and tree.

Adrienne's name appears as Adriana, Ariaantje; surname: cuville, cuvalje, civilje, and cuvel. In French, Cuvellier means a maker of small tubs or casks; and Kupyer in Dutch has the same meaning. Sometimes this was used as her last name.

She remarried Jan Jansen Damen (see spouses field). From Edwin R. Hayes (Des Moines, IA), Margaret Ferel Hayes (see Vigne's note field): "Before her remarriage she had entered into a settlement with Vigne's children and promised to pay 200 guilders to each of her two married daughters from Vigne's estate, and over 300 guilders for the keep and schooling of the other 2 underage children.

Bennett; National Gen. Soc. Qtrly notes that she amused herself by kicking (playing ball) with the heads of native American men killed in an attack by Kieft (leader at the time) on them in 1643! Kieft led a massacre of some indians in 1643, one of the sons-in-law returned with 30 prisoners and the heads of several dead indians.

Henri and Barbara van der Zee; A Sweet and Alien Land: The Story of Dutch New York (NY:Viking Press, 1978), p. 129 adds:

The soldiers were "flushed with victory" and ran through the streets parading two indians and the heads of more on sticks. "When one of the heads fell on the ground, VanTienhoven's French mother-in-law, Adrienne Culville, the wife of Jan Damen, was so exulted that she gave it a kick. Not everyone enjoyed the sight, or approved of the massacre, and some of the other women violently 'upbraided' Adrienne, whose husband and son-in-law, they felt, were responsible for the war."

aft 11 Sep 1580 Because Robert died when his son and heir was only 11 years old and the lands in Leyland and Clayton were held by feudal tenure, William during his minority was liable to be treated as a ward of his superior lord. Isobel tried hard to avoid this, and was helped by her eldest brother and John Banaster. Court battles were fought between Isobel and Sir Edmund Huddleston as well as between Isobel and her brother Richard along with John Banaster not only for the control but the actual physical person William. We do not know if there was indeed bad feelings between Isobel and her brother and John Banaster or if this was a plan in the legal moves against the Huddlestons. These numerous court battles argue not only over the rights of William the heir but over those of the younger children. Although not conversant with English laws and

customs of the times, I wonder if this has anythingto do with Peter I's statements of rights he might have in England.

This article shows how an ancient record of a dispute arising from a young man's indifference toward his wife resolves the confusion as to

the parentage of Margaret Radcliffe, who married Nicholas Rishton. Margaret and Nicholas are ancestors of Peter Worden I of Massachusetts

through the marriage of their daughter Agnes Rishton to Richard Worthington of Blainscough, Lancashire after 1504.

In 1876, fifty years after the death of Thomas Dunham Whittaker, the compiler of An History of the Original Parish of Whalley, his successors published the fourth edition of this work, revised and enlarged. In volume 2, p. 292a, a pedigree of the Radclyffe family said to have been compiled by William Radclyffe, Rouge Croix Pursuivant, an official of the College of Arms early in the 19th Century, identifies the wife of Nicholas Rishton as the daughter of James and Joan (Tempest) Radclyffe. On p. 298, however, the pedigree

of Rishton of Dunkenhalgh says that Nicholas was born after 1454 and that he married "Margaret, dau. of John Radcliffe, Esq., of the Tower, mar. deed 20 June 1471."

The Victoria History of the County of Lancaster, edited by William Farrer and J. Brownbill, (1911), hereafter cited as VCH Lancaster 6, p.

240, agrees with the latter, stating that in 1471 Nicholas married "Margaret daughter of John Radcliffe of Peasfurlong." The article cites a document in the Towneley collection as its authority on this point. Peasfurlong, which consisted of a quarter part of the township of Culcheth in Lancashire, was one of the estates held by the family of Radcliffe of Radcliffe, sometimes referred to as "of the Tower."

VCH Lancaster 4, pp. 156-160; and 6, pp. 58-59.

Despite these authorities, the respected antiquarian Charles P. Hampson, in his The Book of the Radclyffes (1940), p. 28, says that Margaret, the younger daughter of James Radcliffe and Joan, daughter of Sir John Tempest, married Nicholas Rushton [Rishton]. On pp. 27-28, Hampson observes that this Margaret's eldest brother, Richard Radcliffe, was born in 1379 and that Elizabeth, her eldest sister, died in 1442. Had Hampson consulted the Victoria History or Whittaker's Whalley, both of which were available to him, he would have realized that chronology prevented the Margaret Radclyffe, who was the subject of a 1471 contract to marry Nicholas Rishton who was born after 1454, from being the sister of a man born in 1379 or of a woman who died in 1442.

I (author of this article) have not gained access to the Towneley Collection of manuscripts, some of which are now held in the British Library and others are included in the library of the Chetham Society. Fortunately, there is a document preserved among those of the Rishton family, that presentsclear proof that VCH Lancaster 6 was correct in identifying Nicholas Rishton's wife Margaret as the daughter of John Radcliffe of Peasfurlong. This document, as abstracted in an article edited by G.A. Stocks and James Tait, "Dunkenhalgh Deeds," in Remains Historical and Literary Lancaster and Chester, published by the Chetham Society, vol. 80 (new series 1921), p. 39, follows:

14 March, 17 Edward IV. 1477

Indenture between John Ratcliff and Henry Rissheton. The parties have sworn upon the Holy Evangelists to fulfil the dome of us, John Ormeston Hugh Adlyngton, John, son of Richard Radcliff, and James Whitacre. We find that more largely trespass has been done to Henry (in the matter of

recovery of lands and tenements in Rishton by Henry, against Thomas Talbot, Esquire, and trespasses of the said John Radcliffe in Oswaldtwistle) than to John, who is to pay 14 marks to Henry. The latter to cause Nicholl his son, to come to the place of John called Pyforthlang [Peasfurlong] in the Wapentake of [West] Derby, and there to receive Margaret, John's daughter, "as a man ought to do his wife and her to entrete as a man ought to do," before 29 March next.

This abstract illustrates the use of a medieval non-judicial proceeding in the nature of an arbitration to resolve a dispute. The word "dome" as used in the document is pronounced "doom," and means a judgment or award as determined by the domesmen whose names are listed. The immediate cause of the dispute was a series of mutual trespasses committed by Henry in his effort to recover lands and tenements located in Rishton held by Thomas Talbot, apparentlly an ally of Radcliffe, and by John Radcliffe against Henry's holdings in Oswaldtwistle.

The domesmen regarded both Henry and John as culpable, but ordered Radcliffe to pay Rishton 14 marks on the ground that the latter was the greater victim. The award recognized that the heart of what ended up as a dispute over trespasses to property was a serious personal problem arising from Nicholas Rishton's failure to consummate a marriage contracted several years earlier in 1471. Accordingly, the domesmen directed Nicholas to go to his father-in-law's place called Peasfurlong and to there receive and treat Margaret, his wife, as a man should.

According to the inquisition post mortem following the death of John Radcliffe in 1485, he at that time held the manors of Radcliffe, Oswaldtwistle, and a quarter part of Culcheth [Peasfurlong]. William Langton, ed., "Abstracts of Inquisitions Post Mortem," printed by the Chetham Society in its Remains Historical and Literary Lancaster and Chester, vol. 91 (1876) pp. 120-122.

Peasfurlong had descended regularly to John through generations of his ancestors. **VCH Lancaster 4**, pp. 159-160.

From the context of the document abstracted above as well as chronology, it is clear that the 1471 marriage of Margaret and Nicholas was between youngsters--a common practice among landed families. Following medieval canon law, boys and girls who were below the age of 7 were regarded as infants and were generally prohibited from marrying. At the age of 7, both boys and girls were recognized as children until the boys attained adulthood at age 14 and the girls at age 12.

Children, as so defined, were frequently married and, if the girl had reached 12 and the boy 14, a marriage between them was regarded as a marriage of adults, not of children.

Little is known of Nicholas's birth year, although, as noted above, the Rishton pedigree in Whitaker's Whalley, states that he was born after 1454. Margaret's birth year can be estimated based upon the year of birth of her eldest son, Richard Rishton. The same Rishton pedigree says that he was born in 1484, but VCH Lancaster 6, p. 347. based upon an inquisition post mortem, says that Richard was over the age of 46 when his mother Margaret died in 1528. This would give Richard a birth year no later than 1482. Considering that 15 was probably the most common age of first marriage for women, I estimate that Margaret was no more than 20 when her first son was born, giving her a birth year of about 1462. This would mean that she was about 9 in 1471 and in 1477, she was about 15, an age by which the families would no doubt have become concerned if Margaret was still living with her parents instead of her husband.

A birth year of about 1462 places Margaret within the same age group as John Radcliffe's other children. According to the inquisition post mortem cited above, on John's death in 1485, Richard, the son an heir, was age 31 and more, giving him a birth year of 1454. John, the third son and ultimate heir, was born about 1460, having been 42 years of age at the date of his brother Richard's death in 1502. **VCH Lancaster 5, p. 59.** There were two more younger brothers, sons of John, Sr., who were presumably born from about 1462 to 1466.

It seems that Margaret was not the only daughter in this family who had problems implementing her marriage contract. **VCH Lancaster 6**, **p. 406**, refers to an unpublished 1482 deed in the Dunkenhalgh collection under which the child marriage of Hugh, son of Thomas Baron of Church, with Ellen, daughter of John Radcliffe of Radcliffe, was annulled as the parties had come of age, had never cohabited, and desired to be released.

One can only speculate as to the nature of Nicholas's and Margaret's marriage following the 1477 decision by the domesmen. Contemporary records reflect the fact that their marriage held together. Margaret survived Nicholas's death in 1502 and lived until 1528. According to the Rishton pedigree referred to above, Nicholas and Margaret were the parents of three sons and three daughters, including Agnes (Rishton) Worthington, an ancestor of Peter Worden I.

From what place he derived his surname is uncertain, but its signification is doubtless "dividing brook," and not, as was afterwards fancifully supposed, aqua limpida. In 29 Henry III. he had the manor of Hambledon by gift of his grandfather, and he is again on record in the 40th year of the same reign (1244-1256). Her brother died in the White ship disaster, making Matilda the last heir from the paternal line of her grandfather William the Conqueror.

As a child, Matilda was betrothed to and later married Henry V, Holy Roman Emperor, acquiring the title Empress. The couple had no known children. When widowed, she was married to the much younger Geoffrey of Anjou, with whom she had three sons, the eldest of whom became King Henry II of England.

Matilda was the first female ruler of the Kingdom of England. However, the length of her effective rule was brief - a few months in 1141. She was never crowned and failed to consolidate her rule (legally and politically). For this reason, she is normally excluded from lists of English monarchs, and her rival (and cousin) Stephen of Blois is listed as monarch for the period 1135-1154. Their rivalry for the throne led to years of unrest and civil war in England that have been called The Anarchy. She did secure her inheritance of the Duchy of Normandy - through the military feats of her husband, Geoffrey -and campaigned unstintingly for her oldest son's inheritance, living to see him ascend the throne in 1154.

(In Latin texts Matilda was sometimes called Maude. This is a modernised spelling of the Norman-French form of her name, Mahaut.)

Empress Matilda of England and Geoffrey of Anjou had the following children:

Notes for King Henry Beauclerc I:

Henry I (c. 1068/1069 - 1 December 1135) was the fourth son of William I the Conqueror. He succeeded his elder brother William II as King of England in 1100 and defeated his eldest brother, Robert Curthose, to become Duke of Normandy in 1106. He was called Beauclerc for his scholarly interests and Lion of Justice for refinements which he brought about in the administrative and legislative machinery of the time.

Henry's reign is noted for its political opportunism. His succession was confirmed while his brother Robert was away on the First Crusade and the beginning of his reign was occupied by wars with Robert for control of England and Normandy. He successfully reunited the two realms again after their separation on his father's death in 1087. Upon his succession he granted the baronage a Charter of Liberties, which formed a basis for subsequent challenges to rights of kings and presaged Magna Carta, which subjected the King to law.

The rest of Henry's reign was filled with judicial and financial reforms. He established the biannual Exchequer to reform the treasury. He used itinerant officials to curb abuses of power at the local and regional level, garnering the praise of the people. The differences between the English and Norman populations began to break down during his reign and he himself married a daughter of the old English royal house. He made peace with the church after the disputes of his brother's reign, but he could not smooth out his succession after the disastrous loss of his eldest son William in the wreck of the White Ship. His will stipulated that he was to be succeeded by his daughter, the Empress Matilda, but his stern rule was followed by a period of civil war known as the Anarchy.

# Notes for Maltida of Scotland:

Matilda was born around 1080 in Dunfermline, the daughter of Malcolm III of Scotland and Saint Margaret. She was christened Edith, and Robert Curthose stood as godfather at her christening. Queen Matilda was also present at the font and may have been her godmother.

When she was about six years old, Matilda (or Edith as she was then probably still called) and her sister Mary were sent to Romsey, where their aunt Cristina was abbess. During her stay at Romsey and Wilton, the Scottish princess was much sought-after as a bride; refusing proposals from William de Warenne, 2nd Earl of Surrey, and Alan Rufus, Lord of Richmond. Hermann of Tournai even claims that William II Rufus considered marrying her.

She had left the monastery by 1093, when Anselm, Archbishop of Canterbury, wrote to the Bishop of Salisbury ordering that the daughter of the king of Scotland be returned to the monastery that she had left.

After the death of William II Rufus in August 1100, his brother, Henry, soon seized the royal treasury and crown. His next task was to marry and Henry's choice was Matilda. Because Matilda had spent most of her life in a convent, there was some controversy over whether she was a nun and thus be ineligible for marriage. Henry sought permission for the marriage from Archbishop Anselm of Canterbury, who returned to England in September 1100 after a long exile. Professing himself unwilling to decide so weighty a matter on his own, Anselm called a council of bishops in order to determine the legality of the proposed marriage. Matilda testified that she had never taken holy vows, insisting that her parents had sent her and her sister to England for educational purposes, and her aunt Cristina had veiled her to protect her "from the lust of the Normans." Matilda claimed she had pulled the veil off and stamped on it, and her aunt beat and scolded her for it. The council concluded that Matilda was not a nun and never had and her parents had not intended that she become one, giving their permission for the marriage.

Matilda and Henry seem to have known one another for some time before their marriage - William of Malmesbury states that Henry had "long been attached" to her, and Orderic Vitalis says that Henry had "long adored" Edith's character.

Her mother was the sister of Edgar the Ætheling, the proclaimed but uncrowned King of England after Harold, and through her, Matilda was also descended from Edmund Ironside and thus from the ancient royal family of Wessex, which in the 10th century, became the royal family of a united England. This was very important as Henry wanted to make himself more popular with the English people and Matilda represented the old English dynasty. In their children, the Norman and English dynasties would be united. Another benefit of the marriage was that England and Scotland became politically closer; three of her brothers became kings of Scotland and were unusually friendly to England during this period.

Notes for William the Conqueror:

William I (about 1027 or 1028[1] - 9 September 1087), better known as William the Conqueror, was Duke of Normandy from AD 1035 and King of England from late 1066 to his death. William is sometimes also referred to as "William II" in relation to his position as the second Duke of Normandy of that name. In particular, before his conquest of England, he was known as "William the Bastard" (French: Guillaume le Bâtard) because of the illegitimacy of his birth. William was already known as "the Conqueror" prior to 1066, due to his military successes in Brittany.

To press his claim to the English crown, William invaded England in 1066, leading an army of Normans, Bretons, Dutchmen, and Frenchmen to victory over the

English forces of King Harold Godwinson (who died in the conflict) at the Battle of Hastings, and suppressed subsequent English revolts in what has become known as the Norman Conquest.[2]

His reign, which brought Norman-French culture to England, had an impact on the subsequent course of England in the Middle Ages. The details of that impact and the extent of the changes have been debated by scholars for over a century. In addition to the obvious change of ruler, his reign also saw a programme of building and fortification, changes to the English language, a shift in the upper levels of society and the church, and adoption of some aspects of continental church reform

## Notes for Matilda of Flanders:

Maud Le-Vieux crowned Matilda of Flanders (c. 1031 - 2 November 1083) was Queen consort of the Kingdom of England and the wife of William I the Conqueror.

She was the daughter of Baldwin V, Count of Flanders, and Adèle (1000-1078/9), daughter of Robert II of France.

Reputed to be 4'2" (127 cm) tall, Matilda was England's smallest queen, according to the Guinness Book of Records. According to legend, Matilda (or "Maud") told the representative of William, Duke of Normandy (later king of England as William the Conqueror), who had come asking for her hand, that she was far too high-born (being descended from King Alfred the Great of England) to consider marrying a bastard. When that was repeated to him, William rode from Normandy to Bruges, found Matilda on her way to church, dragged her off her horse by her long braids, threw her down in the street in front of her flabbergasted attendants, and then rode off. Another version of the story states that William rode to Matilda's father's house in Lille, threw her to the ground in her room (again, by the braids), and hit her (or violently shook her) before leaving. Naturally Baldwin took offense at this but, before they drew swords, Matilda settled the matter [1] by deciding to marry him, and even a papal ban (on the grounds of consanguinity) did not dissuade her. They were married in 1053.

There were rumours that Matilda had been in love with the English ambassador to Flanders, a Saxon named Brihtric, who declined her advances. Whatever the truth of the matter, years later when she was acting as Regent for William in England, she used her authority to confiscate Brihtric's lands and throw him into prison, where he died.

When William was preparing to invade England, Matilda outfitted a ship, the Mora, out of her own money and gave it to him. For many years it was thought that she had some involvement in the creation of the Bayeux Tapestry (commonly called La Tapisserie de la Reine Mathilde in French), but historians no longer believe that; it seems to have been commissioned by William's half-brother Odo, Bishop of Bayeux, and made by English artists in Kent.

Matilda bore William eleven children, and he was believed to have been faithful to her, at least up until the time their son Robert rebelled against his father and Matilda sided with Robert against William. After she died, in 1083 at the age of 51, William became tyrannical, and people blamed it on his having lost her. Contrary to the belief that she was buried at St. Stephen's, also called l'Abbaye-aux-Hommes in Caen, Normandy, where William was eventually buried, she is intombed at l'Abbaye aux Dames, which is the Sainte-Trinité church, also in Caen. Of particular interest is the 11th century slab, a sleek black stone decorated with her epitaph, marking her grave at the rear of the church. It is of special note since the grave marker for William was replaced as recently as the beginning of the 19th century.

In 1819 and 1959 Matilda's incomplete skeleton was examined in France, and her bones were measured to determine her height. The 1819 estimate was under five feet, while the 1959 estimate was 5' (152 cm) tall. A reputed height of 4'2" (127 cm) appeared at some point after 1959 in the non-scientific literature, misrepresenting

# the 1959 measurement.[2]
